

COVID-19-related guidelines for students

1- What should I do **if I have covid-19 symptoms** ?

You should immediately arrange an appointment to have a covid-19 screening test (RT-PCR test). The list of testing centres is available on <https://sante.fr/coronavirus-covid-19-questions-et-reponses-sur-les-tests-de-depistage>

You should inform Sciences Po Strasbourg by writing to : iep-covid19@unistra.fr

Until you get your results, stay home, with as minimum contacts as possible with others, and wear a mask when not alone.

If your test is negative, you may come back to university normally, in compliance with covid-19-related sanitary recommendations and regulations.

2- What should I do **if I test positive for covid-19** ?

You **MUST** follow the instructions of your doctor. You also need to answer the questions of the *Agence Regional de Santé (ARS)*, the local health authorities, to help identify contacts at risk.

You should also inform Sciences Po Strasbourg as soon as possible, by writing to : iep-covid19@unistra.fr

3- What should I do **if I think I have been in contact with person tested positive for covid-19** ?

If you have no symptoms and have not been contacted by the ARS, you are not considered a « contact person ». Still, having a covid-19 screening test is recommended. **You do not need to identify yourself with Sciences Po in that case.** If you have any question, feel free to contact : iep-covid19@unistra.fr

Whatever your situation, your identity and your situation regarding covid-19 will remain confidential.

Missed classes and academic continuity

In case a student is unable to attend classes in person, he/she may follow classes distantly.

Sciences Po Strasbourg will record classes through the Big Blue Button app and will, when necessary, share the links to these recordings.

If a student has covid-19 symptoms that prevent them from following classes, they need to provide a medical certificate to justify their absence in class, by writing to : iep-covid19@unistra.fr

The student will be contacted by Sciences Po Strasbourg so as to assist them to catch up on missed classes.
