Who are we ?

Sciences Po Strasbourg, also known as the Institut d'Études Politiques de Strasbourg (Strasbourg Institute of Political Studies), is an undergraduate and graduate school of public affairs and international relations. As one of the ten prestigious Instituts d'Études Politiques (IEP) in France, it upholds a nationally recognized standard of academic excellence. Its core programme is a five-year multidisciplinary curriculum combining a Bachelor's and a Master's degree. Admission is contingent upon success in a national competitive exam, with only the top 10–12% of applicants admitted. Sciences Po Strasbourg is also a school within the University of Strasbourg, one of the largest universities in France and a research-intensive university (5 active Nobel Prize winners among its teaching and research staff), with 55,000 students and 3,400 academics.

A global perspective

Located on the border with Germany, in the heart of Europe and just steps away from major European institutions, Sciences Po Strasbourg was the first of the ten IEPs to make a study-abroad year compulsory for all third-year students. Its international strategy has led to student exchange agreements with nearly 140 partner universities across five continents. The school also offers joint Master's programmes with institutions in Germany, Belgium, Poland, the Czech Republic, Canada, and Japan.

Learning French at Sciences Po Strasbourg

Each semester, visiting students have the possibility of taking a one-week free-of-charge French language intensive course. During the semester, students may take French language extensive modules at various levels, from beginners' to advanced. Visiting students with upper intermediate to advanced French language skills are also encouraged to take French-taught politics and/or history modules that are tailored for international students («Actualités françaises», «Histoire de la France et de l'Allemagne en Europe», etc.)

European Week

European Week is an annual event organised for second-year and visiting students of Sciences Po Strasbourg, held at the European Parliament in February. It features lectures by prominent figures in European integration and student-led debates on pressing European issues. For visiting students, this unique experience offers an exceptional opportunity to engage directly with European institutions, deepen their understanding of European politics, and exchange perspectives with peers from diverse backgrounds.

Internships

Like all students at Sciences Po Strasbourg, visiting students can seek support from the Careers & Partnerships Office for their internship search and obtain an internship agreement. These internships do not award ECTS credits from Sciences Po Strasbourg but are sometimes recognized by our partner universities toward the visiting students' academic studies. Former visiting students have worked as interns at a variety of institutions and companies, from primary schools to the European Parliament.

2. The Certificate of European Studies

The Certificate of European Studies (CES) is a semester-long programme that is taught exclusively in English and aims at enabling international students with little or no prior skills in the French language to gain access to the excellence of a French Grande Ecole's programme of study. By combining lectures, seminars, field trips and educational visits, the CES focuses on Europe in a global perspective, while also introducing students to the French language and culture. Thanks to Sciences Po Strasbourg's long-standing partnership with European institutions such as the European Parliament and the Council of Europe, international students will therefore have a unique opportunity to gain both theoretical and practical understanding of Europe from the very heart of its capital.

This programme is aimed at international students who have completed at least two semesters of higher education (60 ECTS credits) and have not studied in France more than a year.

- Students must demonstrate English language proficiency (min. B2-C1).
- No prior knowledge of French is required; the programme is tailored for students who are beginners or intermediate learners of French.

Life on Campus

Sciences Po Strasbourg is situated in a modern, newly constructed building right in the heart of Strasbourg's historic centre, called Le Cardo. It lies only a few minutes' walk from the Cathedral, numerous museums, a variety of cafés and restaurants, and the main shopping area.

Students have access to a wide range of facilities either at the Cardo or on the main Campus.

Libraries

The library at Le Cardo offers a bright and spacious environment ideal for studying and research. It provides students with extensive resources in political science, law, economics, and international relations, alongside quiet workspaces and digital facilities. Students have access to many other libraries in Strasbourg, including the Bibliothèque nationale et



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universitaire (BNU), one of France's largest libraries, offering vast collections across all disciplines in a stunning historic building. Another excellent resource is Le Studium, which combines library services with collaborative spaces, technology hubs, and areas for relaxation, creating an ideal environment for both study and student life.

Accommodation at Student dorms

Sciences Po Strasbourg offers around 50 rooms in CROUS student residences for its visiting students. Accommodation options vary, including single rooms with either private or shared bathrooms, as well as fully furnished studio apartments. There are even possibilities for family housing. Monthly rents range from 280€ to 500€.

Applicants simply need to ensure they meet the requirements of their chosen programme and submit all required documents by the deadlines indicated here.
