APPLICATION PROCESS

NOMINATION OF EXCHANGE STUDENTS

The sending university should inform Ms. Michelle Benoit iep-incomingstudents@unistra.fr of the identity of the exchange students by the 30th of April (semester 1 and full academic year) or by the 15th of October (semester 2).

ONLINE APPLICATION

Online application is mandatory – even if the standard application forms have already been filled in on paper, students must reapply online. Any student who does not apply online cannot be admitted to Sciences Po Strasbourg at the University of Strasbourg.

APPLICATION DEADLINE

15th of May for semester 1 and full academic year.
31th of October for semester 2.



ACADEMIC INFORMATION

LANGUAGE OF INSTRUCTION

Most classes are taught in French; 30 modules are taught in English, 2 in Spanish and 2 in German. B2 level in French is necessary to take classes taught in French. Students who take English-taught classes (including our Certificate of European Studies (CES programme must make proof of a B2 level in English. No prior French language skills are required for students who take all their classes in English.

FRENCH LANGUAGE COURSES

We offer a French language pre-semester course at the beginning of each semester at no additional cost. French language classes are also on offer during the semester.

COURSE RESTRICTIONS

Students on exchange at Sciences Po Strasbourg must take a majority of their modules at Sciences Po Strasbourg. Up to two modules may be taken at another school/faculty within the University of Strasbourg (subject to prior approval by the school/faculty concerned. No modules may be taken from the Faculty of Psychology. Exchange students need to take a number of classes allowing them to obtain between 6 and 33 ECTS per semester. Some modules have a restricted intake. Pre-registration may in that case be required.

CREDIT SYSTEM ECTS

The number of ECTS credits awarded for each class depends on the number of contact hours and the amount of work expected from students. Most classes are credited with 3 or 6 ECTS.

GRADING SYSTEM

Grades range from a minimum 0 (zero) to a maximum 20 (twenty). 10 (ten) is the minimum passing grade. As compensation occurs for regular degree-seeking students, it is not uncommon for good students to obtain a grade below 10 (ten) for one or several module(s).

TRANSCRIPT OF RECORDS

The original transcript is sent to the email addresses of the student and of their home university's exchange coordinator in early March for semester 1 exchange students and in early July for semester 2 and full-year exchange students.

HEALTH INSURANCE

Registration for social protection is compulsory for all exchange students and must be valid for the entire period of their mobility in France. EU/EEA or Swiss nationals may apply to the social welfare organization in their country of origin for a European Health Insurance Card. Alternatively, exchange students may apply for affiliation to the French social security by registering on:

Affiliation to the French social security is free of charge for exchange students.

LIVING COSTS

Housing: from 175€/month for a Student Residence up to 400€/month in a private accomodation. Meals: 3.50€ for a full meal at University restaurant;
Local transportation: 27.60€ per month; Telephone subscription: from 2 to 30€ per month; Cinema: 5€
